Welcome, Coaches!

Thank you for your commitment to the Stephenville Soccer Association and our community. Your role as a coach is vital, and we deeply appreciate the time and energy you invest in our players. This packet is designed to support your success and growth, both as a coach and a mentor.

Coaches serve two essential roles:

- 1. **Role Models**: You are a symbol of leadership and integrity. Your influence helps shape young athletes into respectful, confident individuals. Winning is secondary to fostering teamwork, sportsmanship, and personal growth.
- 2. **Educators**: While this is a recreational league, our goal is to develop players who love this game. Teaching fundamentals, tactics, and fitness is part of your role.

Coach Code of Conduct & Responsibilities

All coaches and assistant coaches must agree to the following:

- Promote a positive environment and game experience.
- Treat referees, opponents, and spectators with respect.
- Abide by the SSA Coach Code of Conduct.
- Avoid foul language, bullying, or abusive behavior.
- Never be ejected for violent conduct or dissent.

Coaching Responsibilities

- **Communication**: Maintain open communication with parents. Create and manage a GroupMe (preferred) or Group Text for team updates.
- Practice Schedule: Hold 1-2 practices per week.
- Background Check & SafeSport: Required by North Texas Soccer. You may not coach
 or compete until completed.
- **Sideline Management**: You are responsible for parent behavior. Discuss expectations at your first team practice and have parents sign the Parent Code of Conduct.
- **Equipment**: Coaches must supply their own training gear. Visit the SSA Coaches page for recommended equipment.

Game Day Reminders

- Ensure players bring water and wear shin guards under socks.
- No jewelry or metal hair accessories allowed.
- Encourage early arrival and positive warm-ups.
- Show respect to all participants.

50% Playing Time Rule

Per NTSSA rules, all players must play at least 50% of each game unless there is a medical or disciplinary reason.

Disciplinary Benching:

- Use as a last resort. Speak with the player first, then the parent.
- Notify both the parent and referee if a player is benched.



Sportsmanship & Score Management

Avoid excessive scoring. Recreational soccer is about learning, not domination.

Suggestions to manage scoring:

- Rotate goal scorers.
- Emphasize passing over shooting.
- Require a set number of passes before shooting.
- Limit each player to one goal per game
- Encourage assists and teamwork.

Referee Interactions

If you disagree with a call:

- Reflect on your understanding of the rule.
- Remember, many referees are new and learning.
- Never criticize or confront referees.
- If necessary, ask a parent to find a board member.

Referee Authority:

- Referees may issue up to three warnings before ejecting a coach.
- Coaches may be warned for their own behavior or that of their spectators.
- Only board members can remove spectators.

Post-Game Etiquette:

- Shake hands with referees and thank them.
- Offer praise and encouragement, especially to younger referees.

SSA is committed to growing our referee pool. Coaches play a key role in supporting and mentoring referees.



Weather Policy

Game Cancellations

- Do not assume games are canceled. Wait for official notice from your commissioner.
- If your team does not show up and the game is not canceled, if will result in a forfeit.

Before contacting your commissioner:

- Be patient. Updates will be provided as soon as decisions are made.

Rescheduled Games:

- May be held during the week.
- Coaches are responsible for communicating schedule changes via GroupMe.



Parental Code of Conduct

Parents must review the following and sign and date on the back.

Key expectations:

- Encourage rather than criticize.
- Respect coaches, officials, and opponents.
- Applaud good plays from both teams.
- Avoid questioning officials' integrity.
- Accept game outcomes with grace.
- Remember, the sport is for your child's enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules.
- Lead by example.
- Avoid foul language and bullying.
- Support team decisions and strategy.
- If asked to leave by a board member, comply respectfully.

Disciplinary Actions:

- Yellow Card: Coach discretion.
- Red Card: Player must attend the next game but remain on the bench. A sit-out verification form must be signed by the referee.
